## **Policy Statement**

The Library Board is open to relevant communication from persons or groups in the community. For efficiency and time management specific procedures need to be followed.

## Purpose/Rationale

Under section 5(1) of the Libraries Regulation every meeting of a board is open to the public. Under section 5(2) of the Libraries Regulation a person or group may make representations to a board at its meeting if the representation relates to the board and its programs.

## **Procedures**

- 1. Members of the public are attending a Board meeting primarily to observe the proceedings. Public attendees are not permitted to make verbal comments on agenda items but may submit written comments to the Chair at any time.
- 2. At the discretion of the Chair, an attendee may be allowed to ask a question for clarification.
- 3. If a member of the public or a group wishes to make a presentation to the Board at a Board meeting, a written request must be submitted to the Board Chair or the Library Director.
  - 3.1. The request should include the topic, the number of people in the group, the speaker, speaker contact information and a summary of the information to be presented.
  - 3.2. If the presentation is deemed relevant, the item will be scheduled into an agenda for a Board meeting within the next three (3) months.
  - 3.3. The Board will not entertain presentations that are in conflict with the Library's mission and values or that are political in nature.
  - 3.4. A presentation must be limited to no more than five (5) minutes (exclusive of questions from the Board).
  - 3.5. A group may have up to three speakers, but the number of speakers does not change the five minute time limit for a presentation.
  - 3.6. At the discretion of the Chair, the presenting group may be allowed to ask questions.
  - 3.7. Anyone making a presentation to the Board must:
    - only speak on the subject(s) for which they have received approval
    - obey the rules of procedure and any decision of the Chair
    - refrain from using offensive language
    - refrain from speaking disrespectfully of another person or group.
  - 3.8. If the presenter fails to abide by these rules the Chair will end the presentation and ask the presenter to withdraw immediately.
